We received a grant from 3ie in 2021 to scale up RUDI, an innovation by Self Employed Womens Association (SEWA), through the National Rural Livelihood Missions (NRLM) in the states of Madhya Pradesh, Uttar Pradesh in India. In Latin America, we worked closely with Poverty Stoplight to support the design, systematization and implementation of a community program that recruits volunteers to deliver the program in diverse communities across Paraguay. In Peru, we supported the Cooperation Fund for Social Development (FONCODES) in their work with rural entrepreneurs that are bringing positive change to their communities. Our clients are our greatest joy, always reminding us that the work that we do matters and igniting a fire to change development thinking more broadly.

Thanks to everyone who donated to Imago in 2021 for their unwavering support. In 2021 we raised over one hundred thousand dollars through the Community Connections Campaign in the World Bank Group. Our scaling up would not be possible without their passion and commitment as well as the support we receive from our clients and donors.



### **Adaptive Evaluation:**

# Scaling Convergence of Social and Economic Programs in Madhya Pradesh and Bihar

In December 2021, we started an adaptive evaluation, funded by the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation, to generate evidence on the effectiveness of developing convergence mechanisms between economic and social programs for driving women's economic empowerment in India.

The project involves working closely with our implementation partners, Transform Rural India Foundation (TRIF) and Project Concern International- India (PCI), in two states, Madhya Pradesh and Bihar.

This project offers a novel approach to evaluating government programs. It emphasizes learning over testing, is open-minded with techniques and methods, and understands the role of the system and context. Finally, it is grounded in the idea that change happens through iterative and systematic learning from several experiments.

## **Scaling RUDI:**

### **SEWA Women Collective Enterprises** from Gujarat scaling through Government

In 2021 we continued with our ongoing work with the Self-Employed Women's Association in Gujarat. Over the last year, Imago built the foundation for the successful replication of the RUDI model, an innovative design that replaces middlemen & retailers in the traditional value chain with a new rural distribution. network operated by SEWA women.

Thanks to the lessons of two current pilots. we will be able to take the model to 100 clusters across Uttar Pradesh (UP) and 100 clusters across Madhya Pradesh (MP) under the National Rural Livelihood Missions (NRLM).

# Teaching at the Right Level:

# Leadership & Organizational Development with TaRL Africa.

During 2021, we continued to accompany TaRL Africa on its journey to the next level of operating capacity and impact while deepening its roots in Africa. After closing the diagnosis phase in 2020, over the past year, Imago and TaRL Africa co-designed the blueprint to guide and support the organization's work over the next few years. This included accompaniment during the implementation phase of TaRL Africa's change management process.

Additionally, we accompanied the organization in the introduction of changes to the extended TaRL Africa team, building up the necessary sponsorship and commitment from key stakeholders, managing resistance, and adjusting along the way.

# Diagnosis, Strategy & Action to co-design a community program

In 2021, we worked closely with Poverty Stoplight to support them to design and systematize the implementation of a community program that recruits volunteers to implement the Poverty Stoplight tool in their communities. Our work included working closely with an assigned co-desian the team program, development, and test training materials assess the first few rounds of implementation.

The program is called Semáforo para Salir Adelante. Imago has provided support and capacity building to the organization since 2016 to create a structure for the program and explore ways of constantly testing the different program components.

# Our work with the Peruvian Cooperation Fund for Social Development (FONCODES)

In 2021 Imago continued its collaboration with the Peruvian Cooperation Fund for Social Development (FONCODES), a government agency that manages projects aimed at generating sustainable economic opportunities for rural households in situations of poverty.

In December 2021, Imago was part of the committee that helped them select the winners of an annual contest to identify entrepreneurs that have the most potential to bring positive change to their communities. Five rural entrepreneurs from the 25 regions of Peru were selected based on their innovation, impact, business model, and potential to grow.

This collaboration allowed Imago together with FON-CODES to start identifying potential opportunities to support the consolidation and long-term sustainability of rural entrepreneurship in Peru.

# Innovation, Knowledge, and Leadership:

### Feminine Leadership Coaching Circles

In 2020 Imago became an impact partner of Lever for Change to support and engage organizations in the Bold Solutions Network (BSN) in capacity building opportunities. This year a key tenant of this work has been the expansion of a feminine leadership dialogue series and peer-to-peer coaching sessions, offered in coordination with the Eileen Fisher Leadership Institute. In tandem, these spaces brought women together to promote leadership growth and provided a space for discussion.

Over the course of 2021, Imago engaged 57 women from across Bold Solution Network organizations in eight monthly coaching circles.

Four feminine leadership dialogue series were held. which can be viewed on Imago's YouTube Channel. Topics included: 7 habits that can silence a woman with Deepa Narayan an international advisor on poverty, gender and development with over two decades of experience working at the World Bank, the UN and NGOs, Sensing and Seeing Feminine Leadership in My Context with Anna-Karin Jatfors, the Director of the Strategy, Planning, Resources, and Effectiveness Division at UN Women; and two separate conversations on Feminine Leadership with Maya Penn, an entrepreneur, philanthropist, artist, and the CEO of an eco-friendly fashion company, Maya's Idea; and with Amy Hall who launched and built Eileen Fisher's Social Consciousness practice and is considered a leader in the global sustainable apparel and conscious business movements.
